Antonio Carnota, a professional pianist, comes to Hampton Roads to render his repertoire of flamenco, classical, contemporary, Christian, and Philippine music. Carnota was born in Galicia, Spain. He has played in concerts in several countries in Europe, especially in his native Spain, in Latin America and now in the United States. He was a professor of piano at the Conservatorio de Santiago de Compostela, Conservatorio Felipe 3, in Madrid and conducted the Orchestra of the Conservatorio Santiago de Compostela, Conservatorio Liria in Valencia and a pianist of flamenco music for the Conservatorio Pitino Flores. In addition to classical piano performance, Carnota plays instrumental music for movies and teaches voice. Furthermore, Carnota himself is a singer and a composer.
