"Some new insights on coastal nitrogen pollution"

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ABSTRACT

Dr. Howarth will briefly update how human activity has altered the nitrogen cycle at the global scale, and how regional trends have affected nitrogen pollution to estuaries and coastal oceans over the past several decades. He also will discuss how global climate change may be increasing the sensitivity of many coastal marine ecosystems to nitrogen pollution. Finally, he will explore some of the latest evidence on how coastal marine ecosystems respond differently to nutrient pollution than do lakes, and draw on his observations from a heavily nitrogen-impacted seagrass lagoon on Cape Cod, MA.
