FAQs

How long is my membership valid?
Your membership is valid through June 30, 2017. Please note that dining options may be limited during summer sessions.

What happens if I run out of meals?
You can stop by the University Card Center located in Webb Center or go to cardcenter.odu.edu to purchase another plan to suit your needs.

Can I use my meals to treat my family and friends?
Your meals are yours to use however you like. If you want to treat family or friends, we would be more than happy to serve them.

How do I sign up?
If you would like to sign up using payroll deduction please visit the University Card Center located in Webb Center. If you are not using the payroll deduction option, then you can sign up online at cardcenter.odu.edu or in person at the Card Center.



Payroll Deduction Option

For added convenience, faculty and staff who sign up for a meal plan membership can have the cost deducted right from their paycheck across 8 pay periods. You must be a full-time faculty or staff ODU employee in order to utilize the payroll deduction option.

Payroll deductions may only be applied for twice a year. The deadline to apply for the fall is August 31, and for the spring is January 27, 2017. Fall deductions begin September 16, 2016 (September-December) and spring deductions begin February 16, 2017 (February-May). You can sign up in the Card Center in Webb Center.


