# Can you send me a list of my students that have accommodations/a copy of each students Faculty Accommodation Letter?

- We understand many instructors who received hard copies of the OEA Faculty Accommodation Letter may not have ability to access that information now. Unfortunately, we do not have access to a list of which of OEA students are in each of your classes.
- We recommend sending an email out your class roster to ask for students to email you a copy of their accommodation letter. We deliver these electronically to each student. They may re-request a copy by contacting their OEA Counselor.
- Please keep in mind some students may not have had to use their accommodations in the face-to-face structure but may need to use them in this new online environment. You may receive accommodation letters from students you did not know were registered previously. Additionally, our office is still doing new accommodation letters for students who need to get registered for services.
