Dr. Sayra Cristancho is an Associate Professor in the Department of Surgery and a Scientist in the Centre for Education Research & Innovation (CERI) at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University, London, Ontario, Canada. She received her Ph.D. degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of British Columbia. Dr. Cristancho's research program investigates how action teams navigate and respond to disruptive events. Her research program aims to shed light on how best to support training and practice for resilient teaming in healthcare. To this end, she developed a unique research approach that cross-pollinates qualitative research, sociobiology and systems engineering principles with insights from various industries, including healthcare, tactical, emergency response, business, and music. She coleads the DART (Disruptive Agility for Resilient Teaming) Think Tank.
