Andrea Smith (Cherokee) is a Native American activist and scholar. Smith has published widely on issues of violence against women of color and is one of the nation’s leading experts on the topic. Professor Smith received her Ph.D. in History of Consciousness at University of California Santa Cruz in 2002.

Her publications include: *Native Americans and the Christian Right: The Gendered Politics of Unlikely Alliances* and *Conquest: Sexual Violence and American Indian Genocide*. She is also the editor of *The Revolution Will Not Be Funded: Beyond the Nonprofit Industrial Complex*, and co-editor of *The Color of Violence, The Incite! Anthology*.
