ACCOUNTABILITY AND PROBLEM OWNERSHIP

Abstract:

This interactive session will include an overview of Newport News Shipbuilding as well as an interactive discussion on Accountability and the key aspects of Problem Ownership. Results should always be visible to ensure alignment of expectations and accountability for all involved and will include at a minimum:

- (1) Safety First!
- (2) First Time Quality Mindset
- (3) Spending at, or under, Budget
- (4) Coming in on, or ahead, of schedule.
- (5) Proactively Managing Risk

This discussion should allow the participants to walk away with a better understanding of Accountability in the workplace and Problem Ownership.

Bio:

David Long is the Program Manager for Carrier Inactivation's and Dismantlement's. From April 2009 to November 2012, he was the Program Director for USS Enterprise (CVN65). David was responsible for the CVN65 Inactivation Program. The CVN65 Inactivation, supported by approximately 1200 people, is scheduled to be complete in late 2017. Prior to holding this position, David has also held the following positions: Electrical Engineer, Nuclear Test Engineer, Nuclear Chief Test Engineer, Manager of Manufacturing Operations and Supply Chain Planning, Manager of Nuclear Quality, Director of Radiological Controls, Aircraft Carrier Propulsion Plant Construction Manager, and Program Director for Repair and Maintenance of CVN65.

David grew up and still lives in Newport News, Va. He graduated from Old Dominion University in 1986 with his Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering and earned his Master of Business Administration Degree from The College of William and Mary in 1998.
