Geography Program Degree Options

Geography is the study of places and the relationship between people and their environments. Geographers are interested in human activities and societies, physical landscapes and environmental issues, and the technologies used to collect, display, and analyze spatial data from the local to global scale.

Major in Geography (B.S. or B.A.)

The Geography program offers both BA and BS degrees. They require 36 hours (12 classes) of coursework in the major. Majors can tailor their program of study to specialize in geospatial technologies, environmental geography and/or human geography.

Minor in Geography: To minor in *Geography*, students must successfully complete GEOG 100S Cultural Geography or GEOG 101S Environmental Geography. Additionally, students must complete an additional twelve hours of Geography coursework (four courses) at the 300/400 level, with a minimum 2.00 GPA in those courses.

Minor in Political Geography: To minor in Political Geography, students must successfully complete POLS 100S, POLS 101S, or GEOG 100S. Additionally, students must complete GEOG 320 and additional nine hours (3 courses) of approved Political Science (2) and Geography (1) courses.
