The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (post-licensure curriculum) is designed for students who are registered nurses. A separate application to the School of Nursing is required (priority deadline is February 1). Students must complete all lower division requirements before beginning the upper level nursing courses.

BSN students are awarded a total of 33 experiential learning credits for NURS 398 and NURS 498. These credits are awarded at no cost to the student.

* Indicates a departmental requirement at ODU, not automatically satisfied by completion of articulation agreement. Must earn a grade of C or better at Community College.

All Nursing courses at ODU require a C or better grade.
