****PROGRAM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:** students must complete CHP 200, 328, 335 and 390 before applying to program. Admission into ODU does not guarantee admission into the B.S.H.S. program. Eligibility must be documented with a separate admission form to the B.S.H.S. program director.

***For the **Concentration in Health Services Administration** students must complete the following coursework: MGMT 325 and MGMT 340, 350, 360, 417, 418, 451, 452 or 462.

****Elective credits needed to total 120 minimum credits required for graduation.

NOTE: Upper division general education requirements satisfied by the Health Services Administration concentration. Foreign language may be satisfied with 3 years of 1 or 2 years of 2 languages in high school; graduation from HS prior to 12/31/85, or with AA or AS Degree from VCCS.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a minimum of 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program for Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C and ENGL 211C, 221C or 231C, and the writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.
