*\*\*A minimum of one course from three of the four fields is required, one of which must be 400-level. Fields include: United States History, European History, Area Studies (Asia, Latin America, Middle East, Russia, Africa) and Comparative History (HIST 302 recommended). Consult with your advisor.*

*Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 overall and in the major, a grade of C or better in all courses required for the major, including prerequisite courses, 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program from Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 110C, ENGL 211C or 221C or 231C, and a writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of C or better, and completion of Senior Assessment.*
